PARTICIPATION STRAND: Provide avenues for greater participation in the life of the church.

While tremendously grateful for the involvement of many around the church, we seek to welcome energy and ideas from more people—particularly those in the younger generation.

COMMUNICATION STRAND: Develop an overall communications plan to promote the purposes and values of the General Church and seek interactive counsel in bringing them to life.

People have a greater sense of belonging to an organization when they know what is going on, and perceive a voice in that organization's affairs.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT STRAND: Develop, engage, and retain highly qualified talent that has the capacity to advance the church's mission.

We have gifted people who give their professional time to the church. Our aim is to provide avenues for them to be as successful as possible over the course of their careers.

INTERNATIONAL STRAND: Support the development of the church internationally.

We are a wide-spread church for our size. It is exciting to see people around the world seeking to be a part of the General Church. Our aim is to help new congregations and pastors to get established.

The Rev. Samuel Oumpouguila Lompo, our first minister in the country of Burkina Faso (just north of Ivory Coast and Ghana), is energetically developing the church there. He already has 3 reading groups in the

capital city of Ouagadougou and holds regular worship at his home. Samuel's 94 year old father made a five hour journey to Ouagadougou to witness his son's ordination into the pastoral degree of the priesthood.

Through regional clergy meetings, held every third year, and regular episcopal visits, the bishops and ministers connected with congregations in

The **Healthy Church Match** program continues to be successful. This year, the Kempton Society reached their goal and because of that achievement, the society added an 11th grade to their school with plans to add a 12th grade next year. The Korean New Church Corporation

The Journey Program also collaborated with Bryn Athyn Church and surrounding organizations, Safe Harbor and Laurel House, to facilitate the deeply moving and successful event "Finding Hope", a morning discussion of ways to support those effected by addiction, suicide, grief, and domestic violence. The event featured Dr. Dan Gottlieb with a compassionate message of hope, as well as a panel of experts from each of the fields.

- **225** people participated, nearly half were not previously connected with Bryn Athyn Church.
- **25** of these attendees expressed interest in joining small groups.



FINANCE



General Church Operating Fund Results, FY15 and FY16

For the period ending June 30, 2016, we recorded greater income than the previous year in our Operating Fund, boosted by two very generous estate gifts, and fulfillment of pledges to the '08 Capital Campaign. Total gifts to the Annual Fund exceeded \$644k, an increase of \$64k over the prior year. We'd like to thank our donors for contributing to activities supporting the mission: together, we remain committed to help people live a heavenly life through the teachings of the Lord God Jesus Christ in His Second Coming. Your financial support and prayers are having a tremendous impact.

We had a surplus prior to unusual and non-recurring expenses for the second year in a row. Unfortunately, we incurred special costs for severance, the closing of Austin, and a corrective tax issue associated with one of the retirement plans. Despite the growth in income, we still ended the year with a net deficit of \$95k.

It is important to acknowledge that the Church's success in spreading New Church teachings is supported when each congregation is healthy and engaged. Evidence that many congregations are improving their financial health and resulting capacity to serve others continues to grow. Specifically, groups that have reduced their grants from the General Church over the past year include Kempton, Pittsburgh, and Washington (with help from the Healthy Church Match program), as well as Boston, Durban, Korea, Colchester and London. We applaud all the congregations for their efforts in this area.
